RULES FOR TWO YEAR LL.M PROGRAMME (FROM THE ACADEMIC YEAR 2022-2023)

POST-GRADUATE PROGRAMME

LL.M. Degree Programme

Savitribai Phule Pune University, through Department of Law imparts course leading to award of LL.M. Degree under the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS). The Course is governed by Rules and Regulations for Credit and Semester System in Post-Graduate Departments of University.

Department of Law of Savitribai Phule Pune University offers LL.M Degree in Three Specialized Branches of Law.

Admission

Admissions shall be secured through Common Entrance Examination (CEE) as per the rules laid down by the Savitribai Phule Pune University, Pune.

Intake and Reservation

The total number of students' intake is 60. The number of students to be admitted in each branch of the LL.M. Degree Programme is limited to 20. The admissions to LLM programme will be as per the Reservation Policy adopted by the Government of Maharashtra from time to time.

Eligibility

Every Candidate seeking admission to the Master of Laws Course (LL.M) must have passed the LL.B. Degree after completing three years of LL.B. Course or all the five years of the Five-Year Course of this University or its equivalent degree of another statutory University recognised as equivalent to said degree of this University.

Course Duration

The duration of LL.M Programme is of two years. Each academic year is divided into 2 semesters (Odd and Even). The semester pattern is designed with continuous assessment system. A student shall be granted the term for the course concerned if he/she has put in an attendance of not less than 75% of the lectures and tutorials calculated separately.

LLM COURSE STRUCTURE

Two-year LL.M course shall consist of 70 credits spread over two years and the same shall be divided into four semesters. First year will be divided into 2 semesters which will carry 38 credits *in toto* (I Semester-18 Credits and II Semester-20 Credits). The Second Year will also be divided into 2 semesters and will carry 32 credits *in toto* (I Semester-16 Credits and II-Semester 16 Credits).

NOTE: The Specialization shall be allotted at the time of commencement of the First Semester strictly on the basis of merit as secured in the Online Entrance Exam (OEE) conducted by the University.

Assessment Structure

- 1. Each paper of four credits is divided as under-
 - 50 marks External Assessment
 - 50 marks Internal Assessment
- 2. The Internal Assessment of 50 marks for the First Semester shall consist of the following-
 - 10 marks LTP (Longish Term Paper) / Assignments/Research Paper/Extension
 - 10 marks Tutorials
 - 20 marks Internal written test

10 marks – Viva voce test- to be conducted jointly by the subject teacher concerned and another teacher appointed by the Head of the Department from the Faculty of the Department.

- 3. Each Paper of Two credits are divided as under-
 - 25 marks External Assessment
 - 25 marks Internal Assessment
- 4. The Internal Assessment of 25 marks for the III and IV Semester shall consist of the following-
 - 10 marks Tutorials
 - 10 marks Internal Written Test
 - 05 marks Viva-Voce To be conducted jointly by the subject teacher concerned and another teacher appointed by the Head of the Department from the Faculty of the Department.

The dissertation shall consist of Six credits for written work and Two credits for viva voce (Total 8 Credits). The Viva voce shall be conducted by the panel of examiners consisting of the Head of Department, Guide and the External examiner which will be appointed by the Head of the Department.
